Second Saturday Guided Hikes to Begin at Blue Hole Regional Park

Wimberley, TX – If you ever wondered what the depths of the Blue Hole swimming area are... or what kinds of snakes make their home in the park... then the new 2nd Saturday Guided Hike series is for you! The City of Wimberley is hosting the new guided hikes beginning May 9 with the help of Hays County Master Naturalist volunteers. Hikes are free to the public and all ages are welcome to participate; so gather the whole family and get outside!

Hikes start at 9 am on the 2nd Saturday of every month and last about 1 hour. Included in the hikes is interesting information about the history of the park and its sustainable development concepts, information on the Cypress Creek watershed, and fun facts about native plants and animals. During the summer swim season (Memorial Day – Labor Day) participants are welcome to stay and enjoy the Swimming Area which opens at 10 am daily (admission applies.)
