Minutes of July 25, 2006 Meeting, 5:45 p.m. Wimberley City Hall

Members Present: Anderson, Burleson, Estep, Jennett and Hollon.
City of Wimberley represented by Councilman Busk and Interim City Manager Robert Ronson.
Future Interim City Manager Mark Marquez also attended the meeting.
There were no public comments.

Anderson reported that the July water quality tests for e-coli in Cypress Creek and Blanco River were within limits except for the low water crossing at 7A.

Hollon reported that the Blanco River flow is down to 8.3 cubic feet per. second. Over a period of 70 years the Blanco's average flow has been 142 c.f.s., with a median flow of 62 c.f.s. The lowest flow ever recorded was 1.7 c.f.s. in July 1956.

Two forms pertaining to wastewater service were discussed:

1. Village of Wimberley and Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority Wastewater Service Reservation Application.

This is the application form for wastewater service. A GBRA inspector will inspect the property to see if it meets the requirements for service and how many Living Unit Equivalentents will be required.

2. Wastewater Service Reservation Agreement.

This form reserves wastewater service for a certain number of Living Unit Equivalentents at an initial payment of \$2000.00 per unit. The form outlines requirements including additional payments required for service.

After discussion it was decided that this forms should be distributed by hand to the locations where the sewer line will serve. Also that they should be accompanied by a cover letter about how many L.U.E.'s are needed for GBRA to start construction and about a public meeting to address questions about the procedures for service. This letter to be crafted by Burleson and submitted to the city for consideration. Marquez suggested any other ways of communication about the forms and the meeting be used as well.

Hollon reported that the Hays Trinity Groundwater Conservation District for Hays County will sponsor a stakeholders informational meeting about the future water needs of the Wimberley Valley. The meeting will be at the Community Center on Friday August 18, 2006 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The morning session will include presentations on groundwater, surface

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water and rainwater collection. Lunch will be available by Linda Allen catering for \$10.00 but has to be reserved. The afternoon session will be a one to two hour community forum for discussion and questions.
